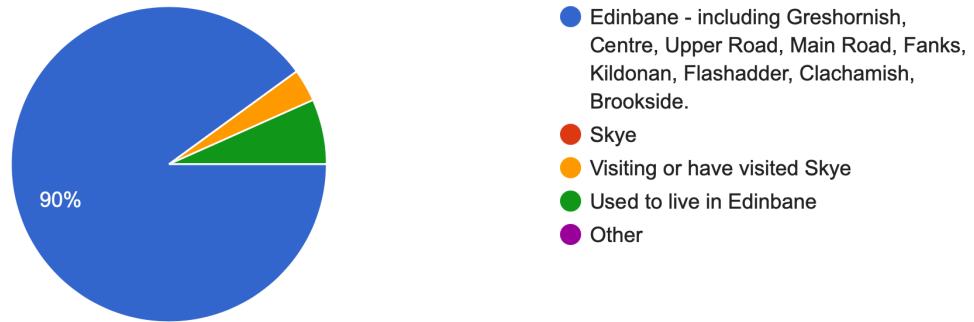


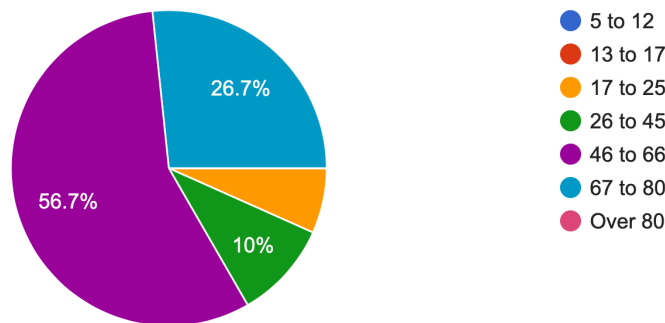
Where do you live?

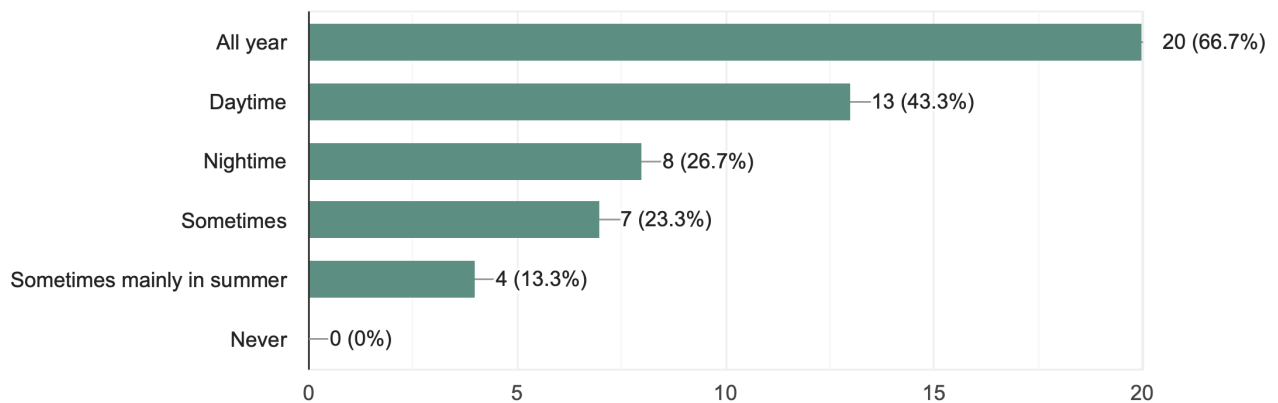
What is your age?

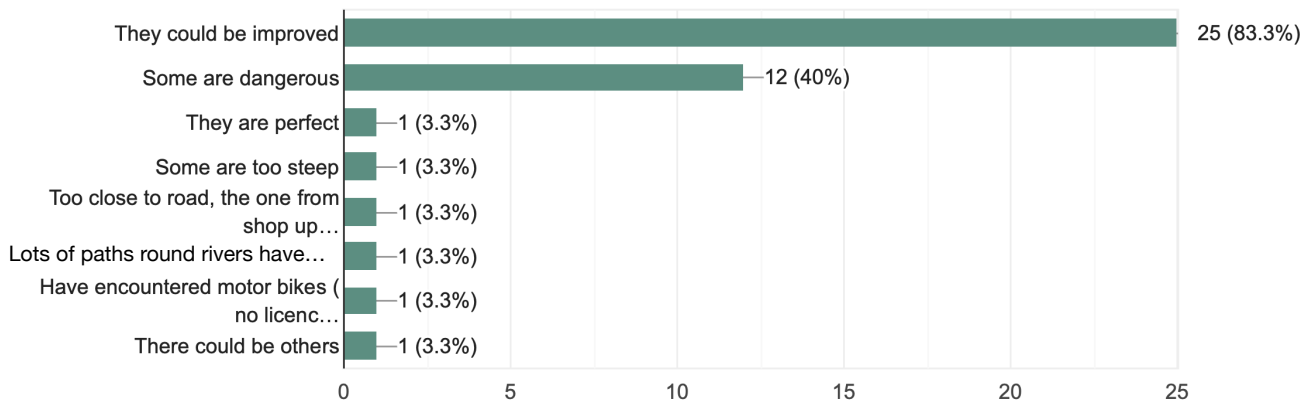
Do you use the paths and road verges around the village? - Mark as many as apply..

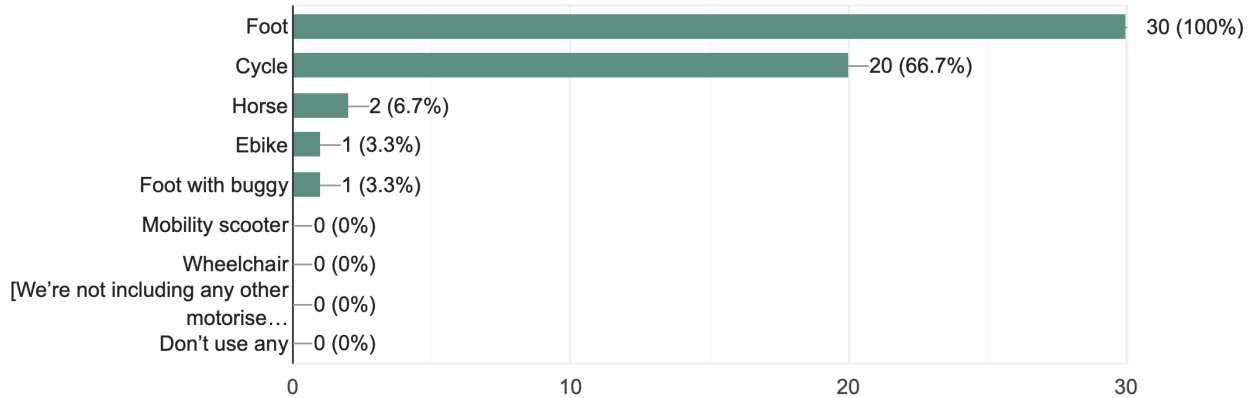
What do you think about the routes as they are just now? [mark as many as apply]

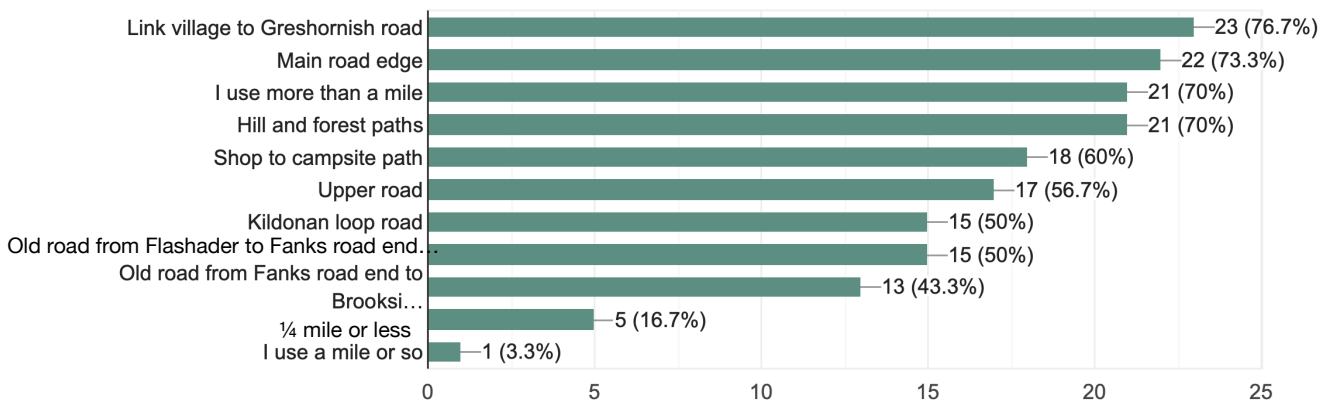
How do you use the paths [mark as many as apply]

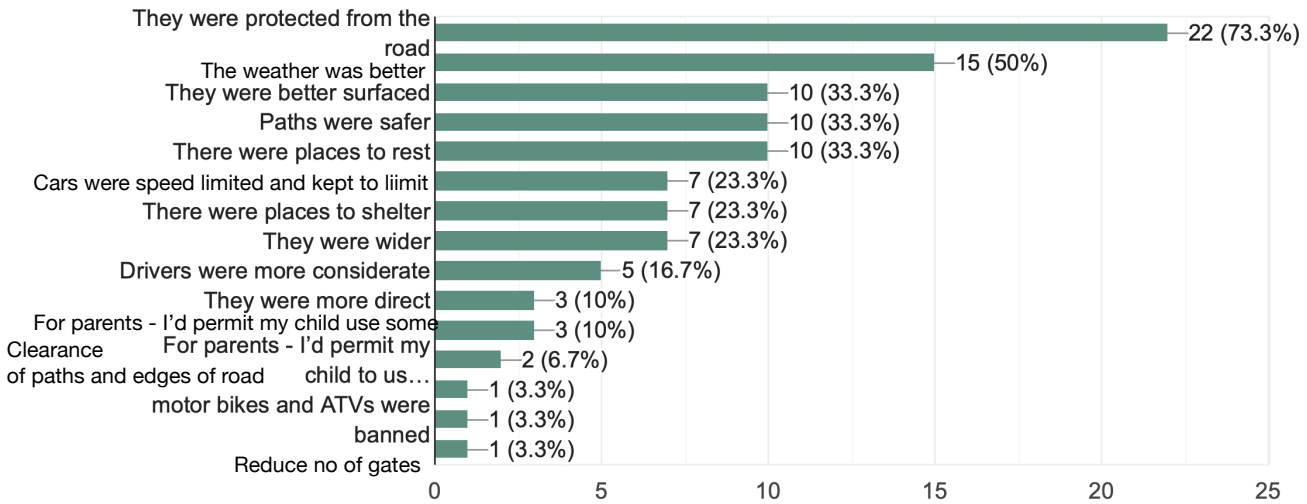
Which paths do you use? [mark as many as apply]

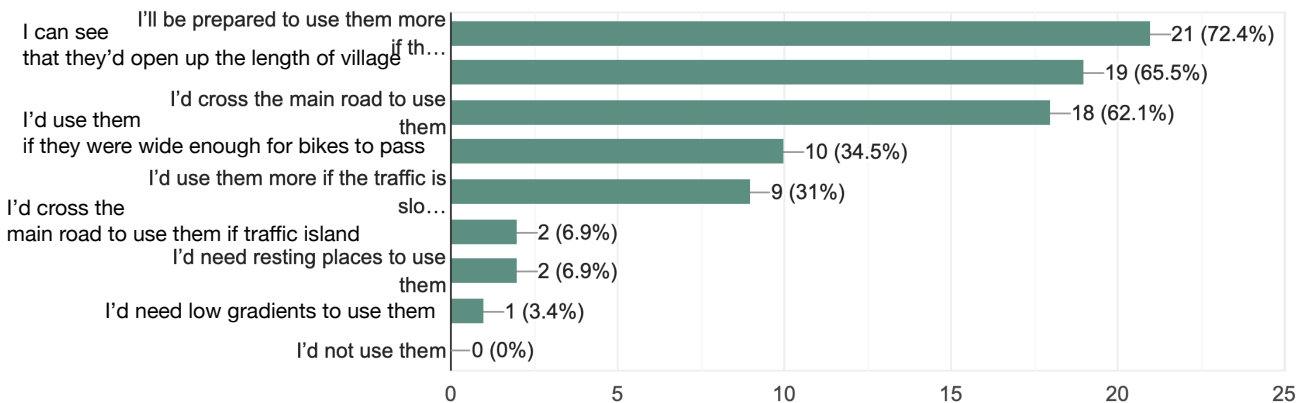

For the new paths - pink line in drawing - [mark as many as apply]

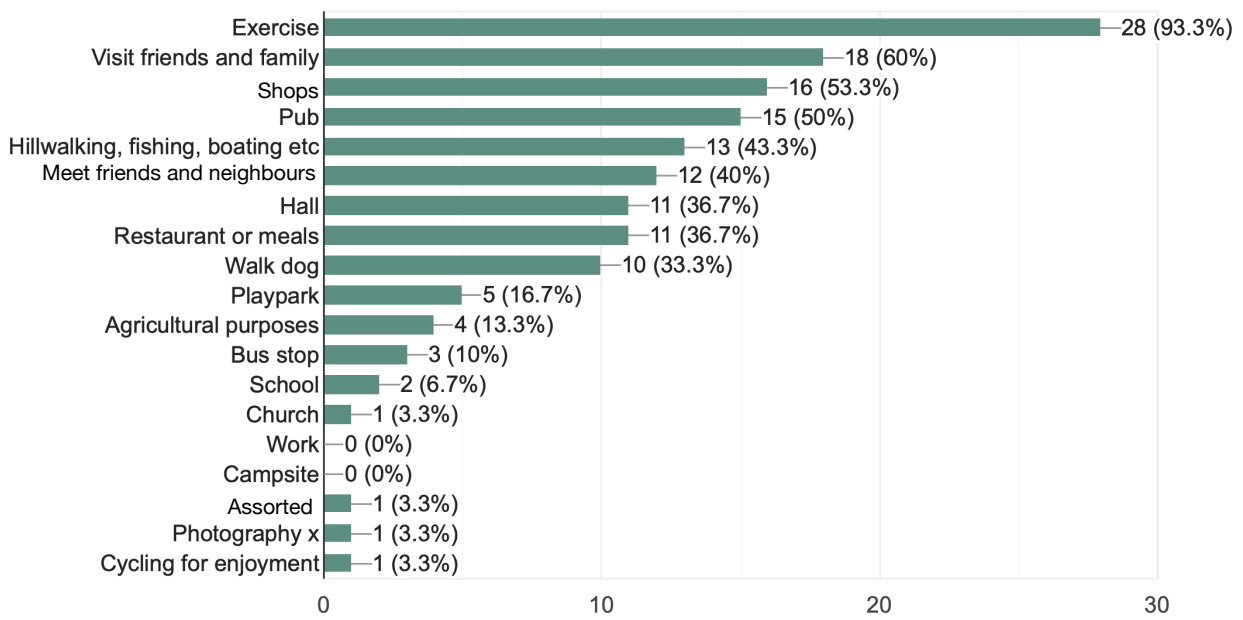

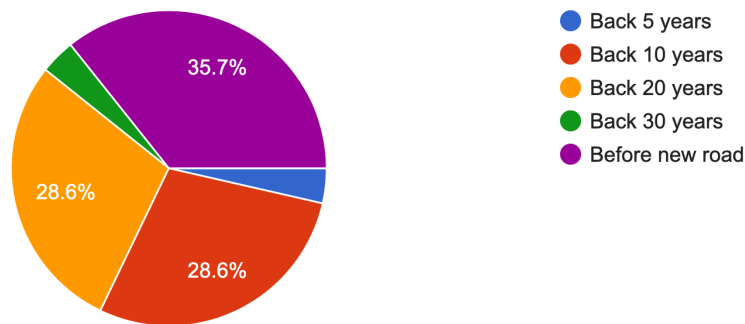

Where do you use the local paths to go to? - mark all that apply



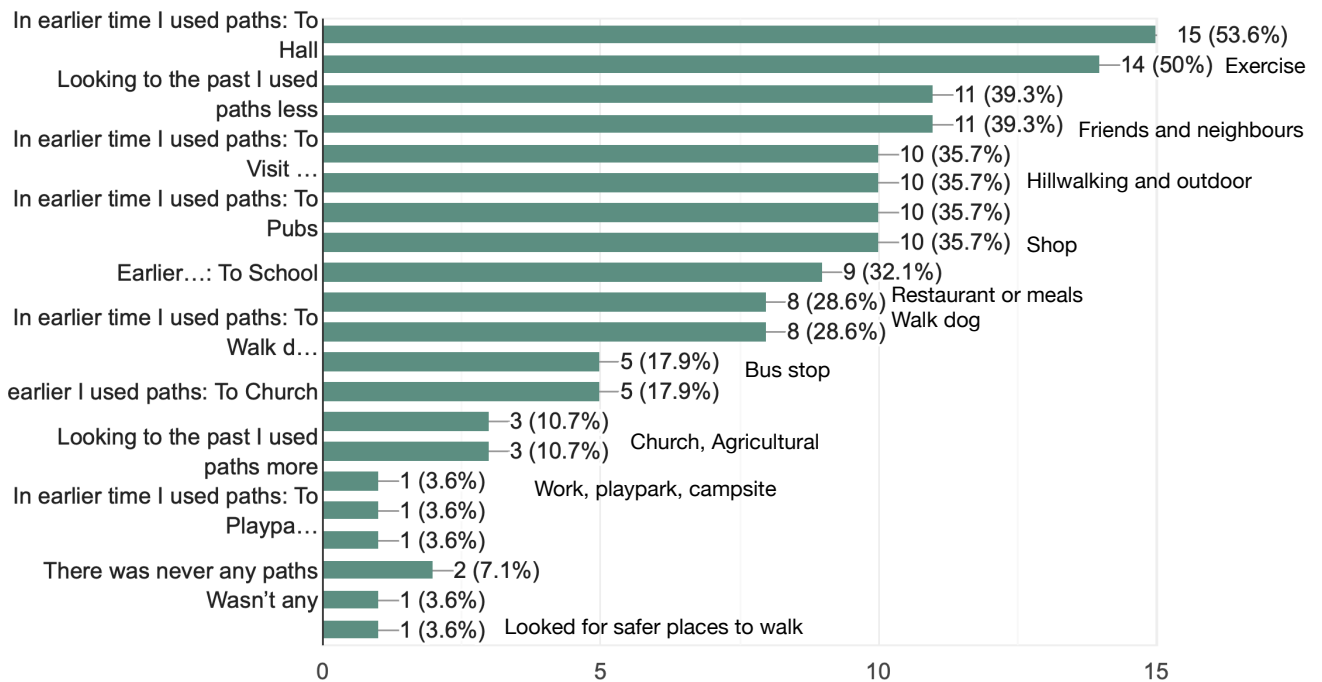
Looking as far back in time as you can, before the current tourist boom or even before the improved road was built - choose one

A continuous path without going on the road (or opening gates maybe) would be good but for me I am happy to cycle on rough off-road tracks and cycle on the road to get there.

However, I know for a lot of people they do not feel safe road cycling and for young kids it is essential to have good off-road fairly smooth paths for them to learn, gain confidence and experience. Space for families to ride together ie 2 abreast is also important. I was knocked from my bike on a road and very nearly killed when I was only 9 (my fault entirely). I was clearly not ready for road cycling at that age. So any improvements to encourage more use of the paths for whatever reason I am all for.

make them a bit wider + separate from the road

If the old road from Braebost to Lynedale is re-used please make sure something is done about the gates. Currently you have to stop every few hundred metres to open a gate. This is fine for walking but on a bike it's so inconvenient that I just use the main road. Perhaps cattle grids could be used to replace the gates.
